# NAG Library Routine Document

# G05SAF

Note: before using this routine, please read the Users' Note for your implementation to check the interpretation of *bold italicised* terms and other implementation-dependent details.

#### 1 Purpose

G05SAF generates a vector of pseudorandom numbers taken from a uniform distribution between 0 and 1.

## 2 Specification

```
SUBROUTINE G05SAF (N, STATE, X, IFAIL)
INTEGER N, STATE(*), IFAIL
REAL (KIND=nag_wp) X(N)
```

### **3** Description

G05SAF generates n values from a uniform distribution over the half closed interval (0, 1].

One of the initialization routines G05KFF (for a repeatable sequence if computed sequentially) or G05KGF (for a non-repeatable sequence) must be called prior to the first call to G05SAF.

#### 5 Arguments

1: N – INTEGER

On entry: n, the number of pseudorandom numbers to be generated.

*Constraint*:  $N \ge 0$ .

2: STATE(\*) - INTEGER array

Note: the actual argument supplied **must** be the array STATE supplied to the initialization routines G05KFF or G05KGF.

On entry: contains information on the selected base generator and its current state.

On exit: contains updated information on the state of the generator.

3:  $X(N) - REAL (KIND=nag_wp) array$ 

On exit: the n pseudorandom numbers from a uniform distribution over the half closed interval (0, 1].

4: IFAIL – INTEGER

On entry: IFAIL must be set to 0, -1 or 1. If you are unfamiliar with this argument you should refer to Section 3.4 in How to Use the NAG Library and its Documentation for details.

For environments where it might be inappropriate to halt program execution when an error is detected, the value -1 or 1 is recommended. If the output of error messages is undesirable, then the value 1 is recommended. Otherwise, if you are not familiar with this argument, the

recommended value is 0. When the value -1 or 1 is used it is essential to test the value of IFAIL on exit.

On exit: IFAIL = 0 unless the routine detects an error or a warning has been flagged (see Section 6).

#### 6 Error Indicators and Warnings

If on entry IFAIL = 0 or -1, explanatory error messages are output on the current error message unit (as defined by X04AAF).

Errors or warnings detected by the routine:

IFAIL = 1

On entry,  $N = \langle value \rangle$ . Constraint:  $N \ge 0$ .

IFAIL = 2

On entry, STATE vector has been corrupted or not initialized.

IFAIL = -99

An unexpected error has been triggered by this routine. Please contact NAG.

IFAIL = -399

Your licence key may have expired or may not have been installed correctly.

IFAIL = -999

Dynamic memory allocation failed.

G05SAF is threaded by NAG for parallel execution in multithreaded implementations of the NAG Library.
